**Research Analysis**

HB 2168 modifies conditions under which certain licenses, registrations and certificates may be denied, revoked, suspended, or renewal may be refused. Licenses and registrations affected include those for architecture and interior design, cosmetology and barbering, engineers and land surveyors, athletic training, real estate appraisal, physical therapy, occupational therapy, psychology, pawnshops, speech-language pathologists or audiologists, professional counselors, marital and family therapists, and behavioral practitioners. Where currently any felony conviction might affect licensure, registration or certification, this measure would require denial, revocation, etc. in cases where the felony was within the previous 5 years and substantially relates to the practice, or poses a reasonable threat to public safety.
