## **Research Analysis**

HB 2237, as introduced, would allow \$25 Million in bonds to help finish construction of the American Indian Cultural Center and Museum. The measure also requires \$10 Million in private contributions as well as the \$9 Million committed by the City of Oklahoma City to go into the same fund. Following opening of the Museum, 50% of total revenues in excess of \$7 Million each year would be returned to the state, up to a total of \$25 Million. Finally, the bill would turn ownership and authority over the completed Museum and surrounding property to a newly created American Indian Cultural Center Museum Trust Authority, which is then authorized to transfer all Museum property to the City of Oklahoma City within 5 years after all outstanding bonds have been retired.
