**Research Analysis**

HB 2337 creates the Oklahoma Unmanned Aerial Surveillance Act. The measure requires unmanned aerial vehicles to comply with all Federal Aviation Administration requirements and guidelines. The measure provides that it is unlawful for an agent of the state or any political subdivision of the state to operate an unmanned aerial vehicle or to disclose or receive information acquired through the operation of an unmanned aerial vehicle with limited exceptions. The bill establishes a misdemeanor punishment for violations of the Oklahoma Unmanned Aerial Surveillance Act punishable by up to 6 months in the county jail and a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$2,500 per violation. The measure requires agents of the state maintain records of use of unmanned aerial vehicles.
