Research Analysis

The CS to HB 2397 adds to who may file for an expungement to include a person was convicted of a misdemeanor offense without a term of imprisonment or a suspended sentence and was ordered to pay a fine of less than \$500. The measure allows a person to seek an expungement for a misdemeanor offense and the person was sentenced to a term of imprisonment or a suspended sentence and at least 5 years have passed. The measure allows a person to seek an expungement if the person was convicted of not more than two nonviolent felony offenses, the person has received a full pardon for both offenses and at least 20 years has passed.
