**Research Analysis**

The PCS to HB 2522 creates the Diane Burk-Dye Act. The measure authorizes a court, upon a determination of probable cause by a peace officer who has conducted a lethality assessment regarding an investigation of domestic violence, to order the person responsible for creating the imminent risk of death or serious bodily harm to appear before the court to show cause why the person should not be ordered to immediately relinquish all firearms or other dangerous weapon owned or under his or her control for safekeeping. The court may issue a Domestic Violence Imminent Danger Order to immediately relinquish all firearms or other dangerous weapons. Any victim who makes a false claim to a peace officer is subject to prosecution for false reporting of a crime.
