**Research Analysis**

The bill directs school districts to compile, maintain, and regulate student records in manner consistent with state and federal law. Districts may store all documents and information in student records either electronically or in paper format. Such records must be stored, backed up and secured according to standards and protocol developed by the State board of Education. Student transcripts must be maintained for at least 60 years following graduation, transfer, or withdrawal. Except for transcript records, school districts must dispose of information in a student record no more than 5 years following graduation, transfer, or withdrawal.
