**Research Analysis**

HB 3019 provides that landfill disposal sites that receive ash generated by coal-fired power plants shall not be constructed or expanded when within a seismic impact zone unless the applicant installs certain containment mechanisms. The measure also exempts ash and dust generated by cement production from solid waste permitting requirements.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3019, as introduced, along with consultation from the Department of Environmental Quality, has no fiscal impact to the state. DEQ reports that the impact is modest enough to be handled with their existing resources. There is also no impact on CCR landfills in Oklahoma, as none of them are located in a designated seismic impact zone.
