**Fiscal Analysis**

According to officials with the Courts, “In FY-15, there were 9,760 misdemeanor DUI cases filed in district court. The district court receives \$197.50 for a misdemeanor DUI when the arrest was made by a municipal officer. The fiscal impact would be dependent upon the number of misdemeanor DUI cases filed in a limited municipal criminal court of record instead of the district court. The revenue loss per case would be \$197.50.”
