**Fiscal Analysis**

The CS on SB 1142, which deals with feral swine, adds feral swine to the eligible animals list for several hunting licenses. It creates an additional hunting license for feral swine for nonresidents which will be valid for hunting feral swine during the calendar year for \$10.00.

Of the \$10.00 license fee for non-residents, \$5.00 will be transferred to the Sheriff's Service Fee Account of the county sheriff department of the county in which the license was issued and \$5.00 will be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund.

This additional license, as well as the expansion of the bill to include feral swine in several other licenses, has the possibility of generating a minimal positive revenue impact to involved county sheriff's departments and the Wildlife Conservation Commission.
