**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to SB 359 creates the Uninsured Vehicle Enforcement Program to be operated by the district attorneys in the state. The measure allows law enforcement to use automatic license plate reader systems to access and collect data to enforce Oklahoma's Compulsory Insurance Law.

**Fiscal Analysis**

According to officials with the District Attorneys' Council, "there is not really a way to estimate how many cases this will create for the DAs. Currently, it is estimated that 1 in 4 vehicles in the road are uninsured, but there is no way to gauge where these people are. Most of these people will be handled through a supervision program and no charges will be filed, but again, we don't know how many people this will affect. We hope a lot. It shouldn't create a negative fiscal impact to the state. It should be a positive impact to DAs and some law enforcement."
