Research Analysis

The CCR to SB 383 creates the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act. The measure provides the statutory structure for the regulation of alcoholic beverages in Oklahoma.

The measure provides that the purpose of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act is to implement the provisions of Article XVIII A of the Oklahoma Constitution, as referred to the people for their approval or rejection by the Secretary of State pursuant to the provisions of Enrolled Senate Joint Resolution No. 68 of the 2nd Session of the 55th Oklahoma Legislature. The Legislature hereby declares that the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act is deemed to be a code, digest or revision of statutes pursuant to the provisions of Section 57 of Article V of the Oklahoma Constitution. The measure provides definitions used in the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act and recreates the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission as a statutory entity to enforce the alcoholic beverage laws of the state.

Section 169 repeals previous statutory language relating to the regulation of alcoholic Beverages.

Section 170 through 195 recodifies certain provisions relating to the regulation of alcoholic beverages for proper placement in the Oklahoma Statutes.

Section 196 provides severability clause.

Section 197 provides act only to be effective upon favorable passage of Constitutional Amendment proposed in SJR 68.

Section 198 provides effective date of October 1, 2017 for Section 4 and effective date of October 1, 2018 for all other sections.
