**Research Analysis**

The CS for SB 711 restores the title, adds an emergency clause, and strikes the enacting clause.

The measure amends the section of law pertaining to the recommendation of a school superintendent to dismiss or not reemploy a teacher. Under the measure, if a recommendation includes grounds that could form the basis of criminal charges sufficient to result in the denial or revocation of a teaching certificate for an offense of sexual abuse or exploitation, then the recommendation should be sent to the State Board of Education. If a copy of the recommendation is sent to the Board, the Board in turn must send the recommendation to the teacher. If a request is made for a copy of the recommendation, the Board must notify the teacher of the request and the identity of the person who made the request.
