**Research Analysis**

SB 959 modifies the CLEET retired federal, state, county, and municipal peace officer identification card which allows these persons to carry a firearm. The measure provides that the card expires every ten years and must be renewed with the submittal of a nonrefundable fee for a background check.

**Fiscal Analysis**

According to officials with CLEET, SB959 will have zero fiscal impact. According to officials with the OSBI, "SB0959 has no negative fiscal impact upon the OSBI. It affects CLEET issued handgun carry licenses for retired Oklahoma LE officers. Basically it changes the requirement the OSBI perform state and national criminal history name based records searches every 4 years at no cost to fingerprint based national criminal history searches every 10 years for \$41, this cost to be borne by the retired officer. It creates additional positive revenue for the OSBI by an unknown amount but not until 10 years unless CLEET uses the original date of issue for existing licenses. And on the operations side, the impact would be minimal. We have no concerns with the bill in its current form."
