PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to state employee compensation;
declaring legislative intent to appropriate certain
funds; providing for increase in minimum pay band
schedule; providing for pay increases for certain
employees; prohibiting expenditure of funds to
certain entities; providing for noncodification;
providing an effective date; and declaring an
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

A. It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature to continue
work toward implementing the recommendations of the 2013 State
Employee Total Remuneration Study and to enact additional
appropriations of Sixty Million Dollars (\$60,000,000.00) or more for
targeted pay raises based on the annual compensation report
described in paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of Title 74 of the
Oklahoma Statutes. Therefore, Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00)

1 shall be appropriated to the Office of Management and Enterprise
2 Services for the purpose of funding the Office's proposed ten
3 percent (10%) increase of the minimum pay band schedules effective
4 July 1, 2017, as authorized by Section 840-4.6 of Title 74 of the
5 Oklahoma Statutes.

6 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
7 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

8 A. Effective July 1, 2017, all full-time employees specified in
9 subsection B of this section, who were employed by the state on the
10 last working day of June 2017, shall be awarded an annualized salary
11 increase of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750.00).

12 B. The provisions of this section shall only apply to full-time
13 employees of executive branch state agencies who received a meets or
14 exceeds standards on their most current performance evaluation
15 conducted in accordance with Section 840-4.17 of Title 74 of the
16 Oklahoma Statutes.

17 C. As used in this section, "full-time employees" means any
18 classified or unclassified executive branch employee who is employed
19 in a position normally requiring actual performance of duty during
20 not less than one thousand (1,000) hours per year, and whose
21 employment is not seasonal or temporary.

22 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
23 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
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1 No funds appropriated for the purpose of implementing the pay
2 increase provided in Section 1 and Section 2 of this act shall be
3 expended by any employing public agency, board, commission or other
4 public employing entity in order to increase compensation for
5 persons employed by a private business entity that has entered into
6 a contract with the public employing entity to provide personnel
7 services or temporary services to the public employing entity in
8 order for the public employing entity to perform duties imposed upon
9 it by law or functions which the public employing entity is
10 authorized to perform by law. The provisions of this section shall
11 not be construed to prohibit increases in compensation to a vendor
12 performing other types of services pursuant to a sole source
13 contract or contract awarded pursuant to The Oklahoma Central
14 Purchasing Act.

15 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.

16 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
