9	An Act relating to crimes and punishments; creating Austin Almanza's Law; prohibiting the sale of or			
10	providing a crossbow to any child with exception; providing further exception; prohibiting a child from			
11 12	possessing a crossbow with exception; providing penalties; authorizing civil damages; defining terms;

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1273A of Title 21, unless there			
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
19	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as "Austin			
20	Almanza's Law".			
21	B. It shall be unlawful for any person within this state to			
22	sell or give to any child a crossbow; provided, the provisions of			
23	this section shall not prohibit a parent of a child or legal			
24	guardian of a child from giving the child a crossbow for			

participation in hunting animals or fowl, hunter safety classes,

education and training in the safe use and handling of a crossbow;

and provided further, all hunting activities shall be in compliance

with youth hunting laws provided in Sections 4-112 and 4-112A of

Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

- C. It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian to intentionally, knowingly or recklessly permit his or her child to possess a crossbow, if such parent or guardian is aware of a substantial risk that the child will use the weapon to commit a criminal offense or if the child has either been adjudicated a delinquent or has been convicted as an adult for any criminal offense that contains as an element the threat or use of physical force against the person of another.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any child to possess a crossbow, except used for participation in hunting animals or fowl, hunter safety classes, education and training in the safe use and handling of a crossbow; provided, all hunting activities shall be in compliance with youth hunting laws provided in Sections 4-112 and 4-112A of Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- E. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon a first conviction, be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor and the party offending shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to

exceed thirty (30) days or both such fine and imprisonment. On the second and every subsequent violation, the party offending shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not less than thirty (30) days nor more than three (3) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Any child violating the provisions of this section shall be subject to adjudication as a delinquent. In addition, any person violating the provisions of subsection A or B of this section shall be liable for civil damages for any injury or death to any person and for any damage to property, as provided in Section 10 of Title 23 of the Oklahoma Statutes, resulting from any discharge of a crossbow by the child that the person had given to the child or permitted the child to possess.

F. As used in this section:

- 1. "Child" means a person under eighteen (18) years of age; and
- 2. "Crossbow" means a weapon consisting of a bow, with a draw weight of one hundred (100) pounds or more, mounted transversely on a stock or frame and designed to fire an arrow, bolt or quarrel by the release of a bow string controlled by a mechanical or electric trigger with a working safety.
- 22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
