PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to schools; requiring school district to spend certain percentage of budget on instructional expenditures; mandating annual increase to comply with requirement; providing for written warning notice for failure to comply; prescribing posting warning notice on district website; requiring increased compensation for failure to comply for two consecutive years; stating increase is permanent; defining instructional expenditures; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-128.3 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the board of education of each school district shall spend no less than sixty percent (60%) of its annual budget on instructional expenditures.

1 B. If a school district spends less than sixty percent (60%) of
2 its annual budget on instructional expenditures, it shall increase
3 its instructional expenditures by no less than two percent (2%) each
4 year until the amount spent on instructional expenditures reaches
5 sixty percent (60%) of its annual budget.

6 C. If a school district spends less than sixty percent (60%) of
7 its annual budget on instructional expenditures and does not
8 increase its spending as provided in subsection B of this section,
9 the school district shall receive a written warning notice from the
10 State Department of Education. The notice shall also be posted on
11 the website of the school district.

12 D. If a school district spends less than sixty percent (60%) of
13 its annual budget on instructional expenditures and does not
14 increase its spending as provided in subsection B of this section
15 for two (2) consecutive years after receiving the notice provided in
16 subsection C of this section, the school district shall increase
17 compensation for all teachers in the school district by two percent
18 (2%) for each year in that period in which the school district did
19 not increase instructional expenses by a minimum of two percent
20 (2%). The pay increase required pursuant to this subsection shall
21 be permanent.

22 E. As used in this section, "instructional expenditures" means
23 current expenditures for activities directly related to the
24 interaction between teacher and students and includes salaries and

1 benefits for teachers and instructional aides, textbooks, supplies
2 and purchased instructional services such as instruction via
3 television, webinars and other online instruction. Also included
4 are tuition expenditures to other schools.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
