8 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

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10 An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011,  
Sections 10-101 and 10-101.1, which relate to  
11 presidential elections; modifying procedures and  
dates for nomination of Presidential Electors by  
12 political party; modifying procedure for independent  
candidate or candidate of unrecognized political  
13 party and Presidential Electors pledged thereto;  
providing for petition or filing fee; repealing 26  
14 O.S. 2011, Section 10-101.2, which relates to  
Presidential Electors pledged to nominee of  
15 unrecognized political party; and providing an  
effective date.

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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 10-101, is  
20 amended to read as follows:

21 Section 10-101. A. The nominees for Presidential Electors of  
any recognized political party shall be selected at a ~~statewide~~  
22 convention of ~~said~~ the party in a manner to be determined by ~~said~~  
23 the party.

1       B. The nominees for Presidential Electors shall be certified by  
2    said the party's chairman chair to the Secretary of the State  
3   Election Board no fewer than ninety (90) days nor more than one  
4   hundred eighty (180) days from the date of the General Election at  
5   which candidates for Presidential Electors shall appear on the  
6   ballot later than July 15 of a presidential election year.

7       C. Failure of a political party to properly certify the names  
8   of its nominees for Presidential Electors within the time specified  
9   shall bar such party from placing any candidates for Presidential  
10   Electors on the ballot at said election the General Election.

11      Candidates for Presidential Electors seeking to appear on the ballot  
12   as uncommitted shall be entitled to have their names placed upon the  
13   ballot at a General Election by observing the following procedure:

14       1. No later than July 15 of a presidential election year,  
15   petitions seeking ballot access for said uncommitted candidates for  
16   Presidential Electors, in a form to be prescribed by the Secretary  
17   of the State Election Board, shall be filed with said Secretary,  
18   bearing the signatures of registered voters equal to at least three  
19   percent (3%) of the total votes cast in the last General Election  
20   for President. Each page of said petitions must contain the name of  
21   registered voters from a single county.

22       2. Within thirty (30) days after receipt of said petitions, the  
23   State Election Board shall determine the sufficiency of said  
24   petitions. If said Board determines there are a sufficient number

1 ~~ef valid signatures of registered voters, the nominees for~~  
2 ~~Presidential Electors are entitled to appear on the ballot at the~~  
3 ~~next following General Election at which candidates for Presidential~~  
4 ~~Electors shall appear on the ballot.~~

5 D. A recognized political party shall certify its nominees for  
6 President of the United States and Vice President of the United  
7 States to the Secretary of the State Election no later than seventy-  
8 five (75) days prior to the date of the General Election to ensure  
9 the State Election Board and the county election boards have  
10 sufficient time to meet the deadline for sending absentee ballots to  
11 uniformed services voters pursuant to federal and state law.

12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 10-101.1, is  
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 10-101.1. A. The names of a slate of candidates for  
15 ~~the office of Presidential Elector pledged to an Independent~~  
16 ~~candidate for President of the United States shall be printed on the~~  
17 ~~ballot only by observing the following procedure.~~

18 1. No later than July 15 of a presidential election year,  
19 ~~petitions signed by a number of registered voters supporting the~~  
20 ~~candidacy of said candidate for President of the United States equal~~  
21 ~~to at least three percent (3%) of the total votes cast in the last~~  
22 ~~General Election for President shall be filed with the Secretary of~~  
23 ~~the State Election Board. The form of said petitions shall be~~

1    prescribed by the Secretary. Each page of said petitions must  
2    contain the names of registered voters from a single county.

3    2. Within thirty (30) days after receipt of said petitions, the  
4    State Election Board shall determine the sufficiency of said  
5    petitions.

6    3. If the petitions are found to be sufficient, the Independent  
7    candidate for President of the United States shall, no later than  
8    September 1, certify to the Secretary of the State Election Board  
9    the names of the nominees for Presidential Elector pledged to him  
10   and the name of his Vice Presidential running mate. Each candidate  
11   for Presidential Elector so nominated shall subscribe to an oath  
12   stating that, if elected, he will cast his ballot for the candidate  
13   who nominated him and for said candidate's Vice Presidential running  
14   mate. Said oath shall be filed with the Secretary of the State  
15   Election Board no later than September 15 shall be observed for  
16   Presidential Electors pledged to an independent candidate for  
17   President of the United States:

18    1. A person wishing to appear on the General Election ballot as  
19   an independent candidate for President of the United States shall  
20   file a Statement of Candidacy with the Secretary of the State  
21   Election Board no later than July 15 of a presidential election  
22   year;

23    2. a. the Statement of Candidacy shall be in a form to be  
24   prescribed by the Secretary of the State Election

1                   Board, and shall include the candidate's full legal  
2                   name, the candidate's address of residence, the  
3                   candidate's mailing address, the name of the candidate  
4                   as it should appear on the ballot and any other  
5                   information required by the Secretary of the State  
6                   Election Board,

7                 b.    the candidate shall swear an oath or affirm on the  
8                   Statement of Candidacy that the candidate meets the  
9                   qualifications for President of the United States set  
10                  forth in the Constitution of the United States, and  
11                  the candidate's signature shall be witnessed by a  
12                  notary public;

13                 3.    The Statement of Candidacy shall be accompanied by a  
14                  certification of the name and address of residence for each  
15                  candidate for Presidential Elector pledged to the independent  
16                  candidate for President of the United States. The number of  
17                  electors so certified shall be equal to the number apportioned to  
18                  the State of Oklahoma pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of  
19                  Article II of the United States Constitution. Each candidate for  
20                  Presidential Elector so nominated shall subscribe to an oath  
21                  prescribed by the Secretary of the State Election Board, which shall  
22                  be in the same manner, substance and form as the oath described in  
23                  Section 10-102 of this title;

- 1           4.    a.   the Statement of Candidacy shall be accompanied by a  
2                         petition supporting a candidate's filing,  
3           b.    the form of the petition shall be prescribed by the  
4                         Secretary of the State Election Board. Each page of  
5                         the petition must contain the names of registered  
6                         voters from a single county,  
7           c.    the petition shall bear the same number of signatures  
8                         of registered voters that is required to form a  
9                         recognized political party as described in Section 1-  
10                         108 of this title,  
11           d.    within thirty (30) days after receipt of the petition,  
12                         the Secretary of the State Election Board shall  
13                         determine the sufficiency of the petition,  
14           e.    in lieu of the petition required by this subsection, a  
15                         filng fee for each Presidential Elector committed to  
16                         the independent candidate for President of the United  
17                         States may be submitted in the form of a cashier's  
18                         check or certified check made payable to the Secretary  
19                         of the State Election Board. The filing fee for each  
20                         Presidential Elector shall be in an amount equal to  
21                         the filing fee described in Section 20-102 of this  
22                         title. The sum of the filing fees for each  
23                         Presidential Elector may be paid in a single cashier's  
24                         check or certified check. The filing fees shall be

1                   deposited in the State Election Board Revolving Fund  
2                   created pursuant to Section 3-107 of this title; and  
3       5. If the requirements set forth in this section are found by  
4       the Secretary of the State Election Board to be sufficient, then the  
5       independent candidate for President of the United States shall be  
6       qualified to appear on the General Election ballot. The candidate  
7       shall certify to the Secretary of the State Election Board the name  
8       of the candidate's Vice Presidential running mate no later than the  
9       deadline established in Section 10-101 of this title for the  
10      certification by a recognized political party of its nominee for  
11      Vice President of the United States.

12     B. A political party not recognized under the laws of the  
13     State of Oklahoma may place its nominees for President of the United  
14     States, Vice President of the United States and Presidential  
15     Electors on the ballot subject to the same requirements,  
16     restrictions and deadlines as provided for an independent candidate  
17     for President of the United States. Provided, the national chair of  
18     the unrecognized political party shall submit the Statement of  
19     Candidacy on behalf of the unrecognized political party, and shall  
20     provide the Secretary of the State Election Board with a separate  
21     certificate of nomination for the unrecognized political party's  
22     nominees for President and Vice President of the United States, in a  
23     form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of the State Election  
24     Board.

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2 SECTION 3. REPEALER 26 O.S. 2011, Section 10-101.2, is

3 hereby repealed.

4 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
