Supp. 2017, Sections 5-63.3 and 5-63.4), which relate to the petition for state assessment referendum and the state assessment referendum; 10 providing for a continuance of the state assessment referendum; requiring that all state assessments that 11 begin after the effective date of this act expire and 12 discontinue five years after the date established; authorizing a nonprofit commodity organization to petition for and conduct a continuance of the state 13 assessment referendum; providing a date for the continuance of the state assessment to begin; 14 updating statutory reference; providing for codification; and providing an effective date. 15 16 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 18 SECTION 1. Section 3, Chapter 371, O.S.L. 19 AMENDATORY 2014 (2 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 5-63.3), is amended to read as 20 follows: 21 Section 5-63.3. A. 1. Any nonprofit commodity organization 22 may petition the Commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of 23 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to request approval to conduct a 24

state assessment referendum $\underline{\text{or a continuance of the state assessment}}$ referendum pursuant to the Commodity Research Enhancement Act.

2. The petition shall state:

- a. the name of the nonprofit organization that will conduct the referendum,
- b. the reasons for and the purposes of the state assessment,
- c. the federally approved commodity board that will be designated by the nonprofit commodity organization as the recipient of the state assessment,
- d. the maximum state assessment to be levied pursuant to an election,
- e. the names and number of positions held by each nonprofit commodity organization on the federally approved commodity board, and
- f. such other information required by the Commissioner.
- 3. The petition shall be signed by at least ten percent (10%) of the commodity producers in the state.
- B. 1. Within fifteen (15) days following the day on which a petition for certification is received, the Commissioner shall schedule a public hearing to consider the petition. The public hearing shall be scheduled no later than forty (40) days after receipt of the completed petition by the Department.

2. Upon the scheduling of the public hearing, the nonprofit commodity organization shall provide for notification of interested commodity producers in the manner, method and locations required by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry.

- 3. If the Commissioner determines that, on the basis of testimony presented at the public hearing, the petitioning nonprofit commodity organization is representative of the producers of the agricultural commodity and that the petition conforms to the purposes and provisions of the Commodity Research Enhancement Act, the Commissioner shall designate the nonprofit commodity organization as representative of the producers of the commodity and authorized to conduct the state assessment referendum.
- 4. The petitioning nonprofit commodity organization shall be responsible for all costs associated with the Commissioner's consideration of the petition.
- SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 371, O.S.L. 2014 (2 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 5-63.4), is amended to read as follows:
 - Section 5-63.4. A. A designated nonprofit commodity organization may conduct a referendum of the producers of an agricultural commodity on the proposition of whether or not the producers shall levy or continue to levy a state assessment on themselves to finance programs of research, disease and insect control, predator control, education or promotion designed to

- encourage the production, marketing and use of the commodity. The
 designated nonprofit commodity organization shall give public notice
 of:
 - 1. The date, hours and polling places for voting in the referendum;

- 2. The estimated amount and basis of the state assessment proposed to be collected;
- 3. Whether a producer exemption is to be allowed in accordance with Section $\frac{8 \text{ of this act}}{63.8}$ of this title; and
- 4. A description of the manner in which the state assessment is to be collected and the proceeds administered and used.
- B. The notice under subsection A of this section shall be published in one or more newspapers published and distributed within the boundaries described in the petition. The notice shall be published for not less than once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks, beginning at least sixty (60) days before the date of the election. In addition, at least sixty (60) days before the date of the election, the designated nonprofit commodity organization shall give direct written notice to each county extension educator in any county within the boundaries described in the petition.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-63.19 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. All state assessments whose levies begin after the effective date of this act and are collected according to the provisions of the Commodity Research Enhancement Act shall expire and discontinue five (5) years after the date that collections of the state assessment begin or are continued according to the provisions of subsection B of this section.

- B. Up to one (1) year before the expiration of the state assessment, a nonprofit commodity organization may petition the Commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry and conduct a referendum for the continuance of the state assessment according to the provisions of Sections 5-63.3 through 5-63.11 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The continuance of the state assessment shall begin on the date of the latest following occurrence:
 - 1. The date of expiration of the previous state assessment; or
- 2. The date the referendum for the continuance of the state assessment is certified as adopted by the Commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry according to the provisions of Section 5-63.11 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 21 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
