COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to public finance; prohibiting executive branch expenditures for certain purposes for certain time period; specifying prohibited expenditures; designating fiscal year during which certain expenditures prohibited; designating limit on certain spending; providing method of approving certain purchases; authorizing promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.301 of Title 62, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, no executive branch agency, board, commission, department or other entity organized within the executive branch of state government shall expend any funds on nonessential items to be provided to persons or legal entities including, but not limited to, items of tangible personal

1 property for purposes of promoting or advertising the name of the
2 state government entity or its missions, duties or functions, such
3 as magnets, buttons, bumper stickers, ribbons, awards, prizes,
4 trophies, stationery, writing implements, legal pad holders, book
5 bags or similar items. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019,
6 and ending June 30, 2020, and every fiscal year thereafter, total
7 executive branch spending on such nonessential items shall not
8 exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) annually.

9 Each executive branch agency, board, commission, department or
10 other entity organized within the executive branch of state
11 government shall submit a request for approval to the Office of
12 Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) of any items of tangible
13 personal property, as provided in this section, intended to be
14 purchased. OMES shall approve such request if the Ten Million
15 Dollar (\$10,000,000.00) limit for the respective fiscal year has not
16 been exceeded. The applicant may be allowed to modify the request
17 so as to not exceed the limit. OMES may promulgate rules for the
18 implementation of this section.

19 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
