17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-145.8 of Title 70, unless
20	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. It shall be the duty of each virtual charter school approved
22	and sponsored by the Statewide Virtual School Board pursuant to the
23	provisions of Section 3-145.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes

- B. By July 1, 2018, the governing body of each virtual charter school shall adopt an attendance policy that requires full-time virtual charter school students to be on pace to complete all of their scheduled courses by the end of the academic year or complete no less than forty (40) instructional activities within one quarter of the academic year to be counted in full attendance.
- C. The attendance policy adopted by the governing body of a virtual charter school shall include the following provisions:
- 1. A student who attends a virtual charter school shall be considered in attendance for a quarter if the student:
 - a. completes instructional activities on no less than ninety percent (90%) of the days within the quarter, or
 - b. is on pace for on-time completion of the course as defined by the governing board of the virtual charter school.
- 2. For a student who does not meet either of the criteria set forth in paragraph 1 of this subsection, the number of recorded absences shall be the lesser of:
 - a. the number of school days during which the student did not complete the instructional activities during the quarter, and

1 b. the number of school days proportional to the 2 percentage of the course that has not been completed. For the purposes of this section, "instructional activities" 3 D. 4 shall include but not be limited to online logins to curriculum or 5 programs offered by the virtual charter school, offline activities, completed assignments, testing, face-to-face communications with 6 virtual charter school staff or service providers or meetings with 7 virtual charter school staff or service providers via 9 teleconference, videoconference, email, text or phone. 10 Ε. The virtual charter school shall submit a report to the 11 parent or legal guardian of a student who has accumulated ten (10) 12 absences. 13 F. The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. 14 SECTION 2.
