





22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

23 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
24 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-120.11 of Title 26, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Secretary of the State Election Board is hereby
authorized to conduct a data validation of the state voter
registration database with other state or federal databases that
contain information regarding the citizenship status of a person.
The Secretary may utilize the Office of Management and Enterprise

1 Services to ensure the security of the data being validated. Any
2 state agency requested to participate in the data validation
3 pursuant to this section shall be required to cooperate unless
4 specifically prohibited by federal law. The Secretary of the State
5 Election Board shall conduct the data validation pursuant to this
6 section no later than June 30, 2019, and at least once every two (2)
7 years thereafter.

8 B. Persons who are identified in the data validation pursuant
9 to this section as potentially being noncitizens and who are
10 registered to vote shall be reported to the district attorney in the
11 county in which the voter is registered. Upon being notified by the
12 Secretary of the State Election Board about persons who are
13 potentially noncitizens and who are registered to vote, the district
14 attorney shall investigate and notify the Secretary within sixty
15 (60) days of the disposition of each investigation.

16 C. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall provide a
17 report on the results of the data validation to the Governor,
18 President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
19 Representatives no later than December 31 of any year in which the
20 data validation is conducted.

21 D. Personal information, including the name, address and
22 birthdate of persons included in the data validation, shall not be
23 subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act and shall not be made
24 public except by an order of the court. The total number of

potential identifications reported to each district attorney shall be a matter of public record.

E. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall promulgate rules and shall prescribe materials necessary for the implementation of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2019.
