8 An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S.
9 2011, Section 802, which relates to commercial driver
10 training; allowing content related to human
11 trafficking be included in course of study; requiring
12 regular review and updating of content; requiring
13 certain collaboration; requiring certain publication
14 in certain manner; and providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 802, is
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 802. ~~(A)~~ A. The Commissioner shall adopt and prescribe
19 such regulations concerning the administration and enforcement of
20 this act as are necessary to carry out the intent of this act and to
21 protect the public. The Commissioner or his authorized
22 representative shall inspect the school facilities and equipment of
23 applicants and licensees and examine applicants for instructor's
24 licenses.

1 ~~(B)~~ B. The Commissioner shall administer and enforce the
2 provisions of this act, and may call upon the State Superintendent
3 of Public Instruction for assistance in developing and formulating
4 appropriate regulations.

5 C. 1. The Commissioner may require that the course of study
6 for training students for Class A, B or C commercial licenses
7 include training on the recognition, prevention and reporting of
8 human trafficking. If required, the Commissioner shall regularly
9 review and update the training to take into account changes and
10 trends in human trafficking. To establish the content of training,
11 the Commissioner shall collaborate with:

- 12 a. organizations that specialize in the recognition and
13 prevention of human trafficking, and
14 b. the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous
15 Drugs Control.

16 2. The Commissioner shall publish content on the recognition,
17 prevention and effective reporting of human trafficking in a manner
18 that is likely to be read by holders of or people training to obtain
19 a Class A, B or C commercial license.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
