COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to poor persons; establishing  
Medicaid work requirements; providing for exceptions;  
requiring Oklahoma Health Care Authority to submit  
certain plan amendment or waiver; establishing  
certain requirements for Department of Human  
Services; providing for the promulgation of rules;  
providing for codification; and providing an  
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 230.74 of Title 56, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Subject to the other provisions of this act, no individual shall  
be eligible to participate in the Medicaid program unless that  
individual is:

1. Working twenty (20) hours or more per week, averaged  
monthly;

1        2. Participating in and complying with the requirements of a  
2 work program twenty (20) hours or more per week, as determined by  
3 the Oklahoma Health Care Authority;

4        3. Volunteering twenty (20) hours or more per week, as  
5 determined by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority;

6        4. Meeting any combination or working and participating in a  
7 work program for a total of twenty (20) hours or more per week, as  
8 determined by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority;

9        5. Participating and complying with the requirements of a  
10 workfare program; or

11       6. Exempt from the work requirement pursuant to Section 2 of  
12 this act.

13       SECTION 2.       NEW LAW       A new section of law to be codified  
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 230.74.1 of Title 56, unless  
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16       The Medicaid work requirement as described in Section 1 of this  
17 act shall not apply to an individual if he or she is:

18       1. Under nineteen (19) years of age;

19       2. Over sixty-four (64) years of age;

20       3. Medically certified as physically or mentally unfit for  
21 employment;

22       4. Pregnant;

23       5. A parent or caretaker responsible for the care of a  
24 dependent child under one (1) year of age;

1        6. A parent or caretaker personally providing the care for a  
2 dependent child with serious medical conditions or with a disability  
3 as determined by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority;

4        7. Receiving unemployment compensation and complying with work  
5 requirements that are part of the Federal-State unemployment  
6 compensation system; or

7        8. Participating in a drug addiction or alcoholic treatment and  
8 rehabilitation program.

9        SECTION 3.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified  
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 230.74.2 of Title 56, unless  
11 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12        The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall submit any state plan  
13 amendment or waiver needed to implement the provisions of this act.

14        SECTION 4.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 230.74.3 of Title 56, unless  
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17        A. The Department of Human Services shall not seek, apply for,  
18 accept or renew any waiver of requirements established under 7  
19 U.S.C. Section 2015(o).

20        B. The Department of Human Services shall assign individuals  
21 subject to requirements established under 7 U.S.C. Section  
22 2015(d)(1), but not subject to requirements established under 7  
23 U.S.C. Section 2015(o), to participate in an employment and training  
24 program established under 7 U.S.C. Section 2015(d)(4).

1       SECTION 5.       NEW LAW       A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 230.74.4 of Title 56, unless  
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4       The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the Department of Human  
5 Services shall promulgate all rules and regulations necessary for  
6 the purposes of implementing the provisions of this act.

7       SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
