16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.301 of Title 62, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, no executive branch
21	agency, board, commission, department or other entity organized
22	within the executive branch of state government shall expend any
23	funds on nonessential items to be provided to persons or legal
24	entities including, but not limited to, items of tangible personal

property for purposes of promoting or advertising the name of the state government entity or its missions, duties or functions, such as magnets, buttons, bumper stickers, ribbons, awards, prizes, trophies, stationery, writing implements, legal pad holders, book bags or similar items. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, and every fiscal year thereafter, total executive branch spending on such nonessential items shall not exceed Ten Million Dollars ($10,000,000.00) annually.
```

Each executive branch agency, board, commission, department or other entity organized within the executive branch of state government shall submit a request for approval to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) of any items of tangible personal property, as provided in this section, intended to be purchased. OMES shall approve such request if the Ten Million Dollar (\$10,000,000.00) limit for the respective fiscal year has not been exceeded. The applicant may be allowed to modify the request so as to not exceed the limit. OMES may promulgate rules for the implementation of this section.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
