COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Medicaid Program;  
directing Oklahoma Health Care Authority to initiate  
certain procedures; providing assistance from other  
agencies; specifying certain consideration; directing  
submission of certain information; directing  
promulgation of rules; providing for codification;  
and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5028.1 of Title 63, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority, with assistance from the  
Department of Human Services and the Department of Mental Health and  
Substance Abuse Services, shall initiate a request for information  
for care coordination models for newborns through children eighteen  
(18) years of age in the custody of the Department of Human  
Services.

B. Any request for information shall require consideration of  
and incorporate efforts to continue the implementation of relevant

1 initiatives as provided by the Master Settlement Agreement  
2 ("Pinnacle Plan") and administered by the Department of Human  
3 Services.

4 C. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority, with assistance from the  
5 Department of Human Services and the Department of Mental Health and  
6 Substance Abuse Services, shall provide a summary of the request for  
7 information responses to the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma  
8 State Senate, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives  
9 and the Governor on or before January 1, 2018.

10 D. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate  
11 rules to implement the provisions of this section.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
