15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 13-116 of Title 70, unless there

18	A. School district personnel shall be prohibited from using
19	corporal punishment on students who are multiple handicapped or
20	physically handicapped unless addressed in an annual individualized
21	education program (IEP) developed in accordance with the Individuals
22	with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

- 1. "Corporal punishment" means the deliberate infliction of physical pain by hitting, paddling, spanking, slapping or any other physical force used as a means of discipline;
- 2. "Multiple handicapped" means concomitant impairments, such as mentally retarded/blind, mentally retarded/orthopedically impaired and other combinations, the combination of which causes such severe educational problems that they cannot be accommodated in special education programs solely for one of the impairments. The term does not include deaf/blind children; and
- 3. "Physically handicapped" means a severe orthopedic impairment or an autistic condition which is manifested by severe communication and other developmental and educational problems; or having limited strength, vitality or alertness due to chronic or acute health problems such as a heart condition, tuberculosis, rheumatic fever, nephritis, asthma, sickle cell anemia, hemophilia, epilepsy, lead poisoning, leukemia or diabetes, which adversely affects a child's educational performance.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
