- How the virus is transmitted; 2.
- How the virus is not transmitted; 3.
- An analysis of the transmission and methods of prevention 16 4. for sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and HIV, with an emphasis 17 on abstinence from sex and intravenous drug use; 18
- Identification of risk behaviors and situations involving 19 possible exposure to HIV; and 20
- 6. A demonstration of refusal skills, negotiating skills and 21 peer resistance skills related to sexual health. 22
- The State Department of Education shall create or implement 23 D. a medically accurate curriculum for HIV education. A school 24

- district may elect to create or implement its own HIV education

 curriculum; provided, any curriculum must be approved by the State

 Department of Health for medical accuracy.
 - E. The provisions of this section shall comply with the Parents' Bill of Rights as provided in Section 2001 et seq. of Title 25 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
 - F. All materials used in the instruction provided pursuant to this section shall comply with Section 11-105.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 10 SECTION 2. REPEALER 70 O.S. 2011, Section 11-103.3, is 11 hereby repealed.
- 12 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
- SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
