9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

10 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 983c of Title 22, unless there
12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

13 A. On or after November 1, 2017, the court shall direct an
14 automatic twelve (12) month deferral of all outstanding fines, court
15 costs and fees in a criminal case for any person who:

- 16 1. Is eligible to hold a driver license in this state;
17 2. Served a period of imprisonment in the custody of the State
18 Department of Corrections after conviction for a crime;
19 3. Has been released from the custody of the State Department
20 of Corrections; and
21 4. Has complied with all probation or supervision requirements
22 since being released from the custody of the State Department of
23 Corrections.

1 B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to amounts
2 owed by the person for restitution to a victim pursuant to a court
3 order or child support obligations pursuant to a court order.

4 C. At the conclusion of the automatic deferral time period, the
5 court shall have the authority to:

6 1. Extend the time period for outstanding fines, court costs or
7 fees;

8 2. Enter into an installment payment plan for the remaining
9 balance of outstanding fines, court costs or fees; or

10 3. Waive all outstanding fines, court costs or fees.

11 SECTION 2. REPEALER Section 1, Chapter 392, O.S.L. 2016
12 (22 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 983a) is hereby repealed.
