6 An Act relating to the Public Competitive Bidding Act
7 of 1974; amending 61 O.S. 2011, Section 104, as
8 amended by Section 1, Chapter 40, O.S.L. 2012 (61
9 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 104), which relates to bid
10 notices; modifying certain time period for posting
11 certain bid notices; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 61 O.S. 2011, Section 104, as
14 amended by Section 1, Chapter 40, O.S.L. 2012 (61 O.S. Supp. 2016,
15 Section 104), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 104. All proposals to award public construction
17 contracts shall be made equally and uniformly known by the awarding
18 public agency to all prospective bidders and the public in the
19 following manner:

20 1. Notice thereof shall be given by publication in a newspaper
21 of general circulation and published in the county where the work,
22 or the major part of it, is to be done, such notice by publication
23 to be published in two consecutive weekly issues of the newspaper,
24 with the first publication thereof to be at least ~~twenty (20)~~
twenty-one (21) days prior to the date set for opening bids; and

2. Notice thereof shall be sent to one in-state trade or construction publication for their use and information whenever the estimated cost of the contract exceeds Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00); provided, however, this section shall not be construed to require the publication of the notice in such trade or construction publication or the requirement to provide the notice to more than one in-state trade or construction publication or to any out-of-state trade or construction publications.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
