- 3 | "Telemedicine" shall not include consultations provided by telephone
- 4 | audio-only communication, electronic mail, text message, instant

- 7 | SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 8 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 478.1 of Title 59, unless there
- 9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 10 A. Unless otherwise prohibited by law, a valid physician-
- 11 | patient relationship may be established by an allopathic or
- 12 osteopathic physician with a patient located in this state through

- 15 | 2. Confirms with the patient the patient's identity and

- B. Telemedicine encounters shall comply with the Health
- 20 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and ensure that
- 21 all patient communications and records are secure and confidential.
- 22 C. Telemedicine encounters in this state shall not be used to
- 23 establish a valid physician-patient relationship for the purpose of
- 24 prescribing opiates, synthetic opiates, semisynthetic opiates,

1	benzodiazepine or carisprodol, but may be used to prescribe opioid
2	antagonists or partial antagonists pursuant to Sections 2506.1 and
3	2506.2 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
4	D. A physician-patient relationship shall not be created solely
5	based on the receipt of patient health information by a physician.
6	The duties and obligations created by a physician-patient
7	relationship shall not apply until the physician affirmatively:
8	1. Undertakes to diagnose and treat the patient; or
9	2. Participates in the diagnosis and treatment of the patient.
10	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
