        Section 15. Except as otherwise provided by law, the custody,
    supervision, and control of all work or material required in and

    about the Capitol building and the grounds and appurtenances thereof

    shall be exercised by the Office of Management and Enterprise

    Services which shall make all requisitions for supplies, repairs, or

    material required in the heating, lighting, plumbing, ventilation,

- 1 | Maintenance, as defined in Section 4101 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
- 2 | Statutes, is exempt from such approval requirement.
- 3 | SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2011, Section 15.1, as
- 4 | last amended by Section 1, Chapter 335, O.S.L. 2016 (73 O.S. Supp.
- 5 | 2016, Section 15.1), is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Section 15.1. A. The Legislature shall have management and
- 7 | control of the following space in the State Capitol Building:
 - 1. The space on the third, fourth, fifth and sixth floors;
- 9 2. Approximately one thousand five hundred eighty-five (1,585)
- 10 | square feet of space on the north side of the west wing of the
- 11 basement;

- 3. Approximately four thousand four hundred forty-six (4,446)
- 13 | square feet of space on the north side of the east wing of the
- 14 basement;
- 4. Approximately four thousand seven hundred (4,700) square
- 16 | feet of space on the south side of the west wing of the basement;
- 5. Approximately two thousand sixty-nine (2,069) square feet of
- 18 | space on the east side of the north wing of the first floor;
- 6. Approximately fifteen thousand two hundred twenty (15,220)
- 20 | square feet of space on the north and south sides of the west wing
- 21 of the first floor;
- 7. Approximately one hundred (100) square feet of space between
- 23 the restrooms and the northwest stairwells and approximately one
- 24 | hundred (100) square feet of space between the restrooms and the

- 1 northeast stairwells on the second, third, fourth and fifth floors;
 2 and
 - 8. All space in the west wing of the second floor and all space in the north wing of the second floor that was occupied by the appellate courts prior to relocation to the Wiley Post Historical Building; provided, the Supreme Court shall continue to have exclusive management and control of the Supreme Court courtroom and designated robing room located in the west wing of the second floor.
 - B. The space under the management and control of the Legislature pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be allotted as follows:
 - 1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, all space on the east side of the center of the State Capitol Building shall be occupied by the Senate and all space on the west side of the center of the State Capitol Building shall be occupied by the House of Representatives;
 - 2. The space specified in paragraph 5 of subsection A of this section shall be occupied by the Legislative Service Bureau; and
 - 3. All space in the north wings of the second, third and fifth floors, other than the space specified in paragraph 7 of subsection A of this section, shall be occupied by the Senate.
 - C. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall establish an enclosed vending area within the utility shafts accessible on the fourth floor of the State Capitol Building.

- D. The authority of the Legislature to allot space may be delegated to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Any allotment other than as provided in this section shall be executed pursuant to a written agreement signed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- E. Each House of the State Legislature shall have the exclusive charge of the purchase, use, allotment and disposition of its respective chambers, committee rooms, fixtures, furniture, supplies and apparatus, and shall be responsible for the use and preservation of same. All activities related to restoration, preservation, enhancement or modification of the Capitol building or grounds, as defined in Section 4101 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in space designated to the Senate and House of Representatives, shall be approved by the State Capitol Preservation Commission before commencement of such activity. Maintenance, as defined in Section 4101 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, is exempt from such approval requirement.
- F. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit the Legislature from allowing agencies of the executive or judicial departments to use space within the State Capitol Building that is under its management and control pursuant to a written agreement signed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

G. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall cause to be created a comprehensive set of architectural drawings reflecting the physical layout of the Capitol spaces allocated to the Legislature pursuant to this section. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall review and certify the architectural drawings created pursuant to this subsection. The certification required by this subsection shall be accomplished by the signature of each such officer upon the face of the drawings. Upon certification, such architectural drawings shall become the official record of the spaces allocated to the Legislature within the State Capitol Building. The Secretary of State shall attest the signatures required by this subsection and the signed and attested architectural drawings shall be deposited with the State Archivist, as defined in Section 204 of Title 67 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The State Archivist shall hold the signed and attested architectural drawings as an official record of the State of Oklahoma. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall provide two copies of the signed and attested architectural drawings to the Secretary of the Senate and two copies to the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

- 1. "Public areas" means those areas in the <u>State</u> Capitol open to the general public for general visitation; and
- 2. "Art" means fine art of museum quality representing the highest quality of art objects available to include paintings, graphic arts, art photography and sculpture, aesthetically aligned with recognized values, created by the conscious use of skill and creative imagination;
- 3. "Maintenance" means keeping spaces, structures and infrastructure in proper operating condition in a routine, scheduled or anticipated fashion to prevent failure and/or degradation.

 "Maintenance" restores an existing aspect of the State Capitol or grounds to its original working or aesthetic condition;
- 4. "Restoration" means the act or process of accurately depicting the form, features and character of the State Capitol as it appeared in 1917 (building) and 2002 (dome) by means of the removal of features from later periods in its history and reconstruction of missing features from the restoration period. The limited and sensitive upgrading of mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems and other code-required work to make properties functional is appropriate within a restoration project;
- 5. "Preservation" means the act or process of applying measures

 necessary to sustain the existing form, integrity and materials of

 an historic property. Work, including preliminary measures to

 protect and stabilize the property, generally focuses upon the

- 1 ongoing maintenance and repair of historic materials and features,
 2 rather than extensive replacement and new construction;
- 6. "Enhancement" means an increase or improvement upon the
 quality, value or extent of the original design intent of the State
 Capitol, Governor's Mansion or the respective grounds;
- 7. "Modification" means any change to an existing physical
 attribute of the State Capitol, Governor's Mansion or the respective
 grounds; and
- 8. "Grounds" means all land surrounding the State Capitol and
 bordered by Lincoln Boulevard and the land contained within the
 fence line surrounding the Governor's Mansion.

C. The first chair of the Commission shall be the Governor who will serve a term of two (2) years. Thereafter, the chair of the Commission will rotate between the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Governor for two-year increments in perpetuity. Members of the Commission shall not be compensated except for reimbursement as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act. The Commission shall meet at least once per quarter and at the call of the chair as needed. A quorum of the voting members must be present for any action to be taken. The Commission shall be subject to the Open Meeting Act.
