An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-190, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 6-190), which relates to qualifications for teacher employment and certification; modifying reference to a certificate to teach; directing that certain certificates be considered an initial teaching certificate; directing the State Board of Education to issue a career teaching certificate to individuals who meet certain criteria; directing the Board to issue a lead teaching certificate to individuals who meet certain criteria; directing the Board to issue a mentor teaching certificate to individuals who meet certain criteria; updating references to certain types of teaching certificates; requiring certain persons with out-of-state certificates to have served as a classroom teacher for certain number of years; allowing the Board to establish certain other requirements; requiring contracts for mentor and leading teaching certificate candidates to include certain items; directing those seeking certain certificates to make application to certain board of education; providing for review of applications; requiring recommendation to be made within certain time period; directing the Board to develop certain application; directing the State Department of Education to make certain teaching certificates available beginning in certain school year; directing the Department to identify certain school districts to implement certain teaching certificates on a pilot program basis during certain school years; directing the Department to seek funding for implementation of

certain salary supplements; and providing an

- C. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate <del>to teach</del> to any person who:
- 1. Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements set forth in subsection F of this section;
- 2. Holds certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards;
- 3. Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or
- 4. Has successfully completed a competency examination used in the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets the requirements set forth in subsection G of this section.
- D. Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial any Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history records.

- E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.
- F. 1. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate <del>to</del> teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-state certificate or to a person who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and <del>meets any requirements established by the Board has served as a classroom teacher for three (3) or more years. The Board may establish additional requirements for the certificate as necessary. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state or out-of-country certificate.</del>
- 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state or out-of-country certificate.
- 3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon

receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may
issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt
of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check.

The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the

cost of the criminal history record checks.

- 4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this subsection.
- G. 1. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate <del>to</del> teach to a person who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority of the other states <u>and has served as a classroom</u> teacher for three (3) or more years. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a certification area used in Oklahoma.
- 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check.

- 1 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 2 cost of the criminal history record checks.
  - H. The terms of the contracts issued to mentor and lead teaching certificate candidates shall include the following:
  - 1. Mentor: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen instructional leadership. A mentor teacher shall receive an annual salary supplement of at least Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 of this title.
  - 2. Lead: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to strengthen leadership. A lead teacher shall receive an annual salary supplement of at least Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 of this title.
- 15 I. 1. Any person who is eligible for a mentor or lead teaching 16 certificate described in this section shall make application with 17 the employing school district board of education. The board of education and school district superintendent shall review 18 applications to determine if the teaching certificate candidate 19 meets the criteria for the certificate level requested. In 20 reviewing an application, the board of education and the 21 superintendent shall consider the ability of the school district to 22 fulfill the additional requirements described in subsection H of 23
