Supp. 2017, 16 Section 6-1), is amended to read as follows: Section 6-1. A. Any person who knowingly with intent to 17 impersonate and with intent to deceive, misrepresents himself or 18 herself as a member or veteran of the United States Armed Forces by 19 wearing any decoration or medal authorized by the Congress of the 20 United States for the Armed Forces of the United States, or any of 21 the service medals or badges awarded to the members of such forces, 22 or the ribbon, button, or rosette of any such badge, decoration or 23

medal, or any colorable imitation thereof, except when authorized

- under regulations as authorized by the applicable federal law, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined One Thousand Dollars

 (\$1,000.00) or be imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than six (6) months or both.
 - B. If a decoration or medal involved in an offense under subsection A of this section is a Congressional Medal of Honor, the offender shall upon conviction be guilty of a felony and fined an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or be imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than one (1) year, or both.
 - C. If a person presents any falsified or altered document as proof of service or authorization for decoration or medal, such person shall be guilty of a felony and fined an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or be imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than one (1) year.
 - D. Any person who knowingly and willfully makes a false or fraudulent claim to be a recipient of awards, medals, ribbons, decorations and/or badges which were conferred for valor, heroism and/or combat service in order to obtain compensation, benefits or services of any value shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than six (6) months or both.
 - E. Any person who knowingly and willfully makes a false or fraudulent claim to be a recipient of awards, medals, ribbons,

decorations and/or badges which were conferred for valor, heroism and/or combat service in order to gain employment with any business, entity or establishment which, under its hiring policies, grant favorable credit or qualifications to those persons who list prior military service on their resume, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than six (6) months or both.

- F. Any person who knowingly and willfully makes a false or fraudulent claim to be a recipient of awards, medals, ribbons, decorations and/or badges which were conferred for valor, heroism and/or combat service in order to obtain services, merchandise and/or any valuable item at reduced, discounted or no monetary expenditure, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than six (6) months or both.
- G. Any person convicted of subsequent violations of this section shall be guilty of a felony and fined an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for a period of not more than one (1) year.
