Any person, otherwise qualified, who has been a 17 resident of the State of Oklahoma for two (2) years, has been a 18 registered voter of the party whose nomination he or she seeks, or a 19 registered Independent, within the county from which such person 20 seeks election for the six (6) months next preceding the first day 21 of the filing period, except in 2004, when such person must have 22 been a qualified registered elector no later than December 21, 2003, 23 is at least twenty-five (25) years of age next preceding the date of 24 filing for office, possesses at least a high school education and

1 has served as a duly certified peace officer, in a full-time capacity, for a period of four (4) years or more prior to the date 3 of filing for the office of county sheriff, shall be eligible to 4 hold the office of county sheriff or to file therefor. Provided, 5 however, in counties with populations of five hundred thousand 6 (500,000) or more, the person seeking election shall also be a 7 current certified peace officer in good standing. Within twelve 8 (12) months of taking office, all newly elected or appointed 9 sheriffs shall complete a sheriff's administrative school which has 10 been developed by the Oklahoma Sheriff's Sheriffs' Association and 11 which has been approved by the Council on Law Enforcement Education 12 and Training (CLEET). Failure to complete the sheriff's 13 administrative school within the specified period shall preclude the 14 new sheriff from obtaining CLEET certification. New sheriffs with 15 prior CLEET certification, who fail to attend the sheriff's 16 administrative school, shall have their CLEET certification revoked. 17 Provided, however, the provisions of this section relating to 18 qualifications shall not apply to any person serving as a county 19 sheriff or to any person previously serving as county sheriff prior 20 to the adoption of this statute. 21 For purposes of this section, "peace officer" shall mean a full-22 time duly appointed or elected officer who is paid for working more 23 than twenty-five (25) hours per week and whose duties are to

preserve the public peace, protect life and property, prevent crime,
