6 An Act relating to cities and towns; amending 11 O.S.  
7 2011, Section 36-113, as amended by Section 1,  
8 Chapter 129, O.S.L. 2012 (11 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section  
9 36-113), which relates to streets and roads;  
10 modifying certain population requirement; and  
11 providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2011, Section 36-113, as  
14 amended by Section 1, Chapter 129, O.S.L. 2012 (11 O.S. Supp. 2016,  
15 Section 36-113), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 36-113. A. The Department of Transportation may, or  
17 the board of county commissioners of any county or federally  
18 recognized tribal government shall, by agreement with the governing  
19 body of a municipality having a population less than five thousand  
20 (5,000), construct, improve, repair or maintain any of the streets  
21 of the municipality.

22 B. The board of county commissioners may construct, improve,  
23 repair, or maintain any of the streets of a municipality having a  
24 population of less than five thousand (5,000) persons subject to

1 agreement between the governing bodies of the county and the  
2 municipality without regard to whether the municipality has passed a  
3 sales tax with proceeds earmarked to construct, improve, repair or  
4 maintain any of the streets or roadways of such municipality.

5 C. The board of county commissioners may construct, improve,  
6 repair or maintain any of the streets of a municipality having a  
7 population of greater than five thousand (5,000) persons but less  
8 than fifteen thousand (15,000) persons if the municipality has  
9 passed a sales tax with the proceeds earmarked to construct,  
10 improve, repair or maintain any of the streets or roadways of such  
11 municipality.

12 D. The board of county commissioners may construct, improve,  
13 repair, or maintain any of the streets of a municipality if the  
14 county has a population in excess of ~~five hundred thousand (500,000)~~  
15 one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) persons according to the most  
16 recent Federal Decennial Census. The agreements entered into  
17 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection may be performed  
18 without regard to whether the municipality has passed a sales tax  
19 with proceeds earmarked to construct, improve, repair or maintain  
20 any of the streets or roadways of such municipality.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
