8 An Act relating to professions and occupations;
9 providing for specific waiver of fees for licensure
10 or certification for certain persons; defining term;
11 directing certain entities to promulgate rules;
12 providing for codification; and providing an
13 effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4003 of Title 59, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. Every administrative body, state agency director or official
19 with authority over any occupational or professional license or
20 certification, and each of the respective examining and licensing
21 boards, upon presentation of satisfactory evidence that an applicant
22 for licensure or certification is a low-income individual shall
23 grant a one-year waiver of any fees associated with such licensure
24 or certification. For purposes of the section, "low-income
individual" means an individual who is enrolled in a state or

1 federal public assistance program, including, but not limited to,
2 the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Medicaid or the
3 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or whose household
4 adjusted gross income is below one hundred forty percent (140%) of
5 the federal poverty line or a higher threshold to be set by the
6 executive branch department that oversees business regulation.

7 B. Each administrative body, state agency director or official
8 with authority over any occupational or professional license or
9 certification, and each of the respective examining and licensing
10 boards, shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this
11 section.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
