An Act relating to torts; permitting liability for damages committed by a trespasser; authorizing vicarious liability for person or entity that compensates trespasser; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SUBJECT: Liability for damages committed by a trespasser

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 80.1 of Title 76, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. A person who is arrested for or convicted of trespass may be held liable for any damages to personal or real property while trespassing.
- B. A person or entity that compensates, provides consideration to or remunerates a person for trespassing as described in subsection A of this section may also be held vicariously liable for any damages to personal or real property committed by the person compensated or remunerated for trespassing.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
