1 "SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.3, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 150.3 A. There is hereby created an Oklahoma State
4 Bureau of Investigation Commission which shall consist of ~~seven (7)~~
5 the following members:

6 1. One ex officio member, who shall be the Attorney General or
7 designee; and

8 2. Seven appointed members, not more than two of whom shall be
9 from the same congressional district. When congressional districts
10 are redrawn, each member appointed prior to July 1 of the year in
11 which such modification becomes effective shall complete the current
12 term of office and appointments made after July 1 of the year in
13 which such modification becomes effective shall be based on the
14 redrawn districts. No appointments may be made after July 1 of the
15 year in which such modification becomes effective if such
16 appointment would result in more than two members serving from the
17 same modified district. The members shall be appointed by the
18 Governor and confirmed by the Senate and shall be removable only for
19 cause, as provided by law for the removal of officers not subject to
20 impeachment. The term of office of each member shall be seven (7)
21 years. The first appointments shall be for the following terms as
22 designated by the Governor: one member for a term of one (1) year;
23 one member for a term of two (2) years; one member for a term of
24 three (3) years; one member for a term of four (4) years; one member

1 for a term of five (5) years; one member for a term of six (6)
2 years; and one member for a term of seven (7) years. A member may
3 serve more than one term on the Commission. Each member shall
4 continue to serve so long as the member is qualified until a
5 successor has been appointed and confirmed by the Senate. Vacancies
6 occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired portion of
7 the term by the same procedure used to make the regular
8 appointments.

9 B. Four of the appointed members shall represent the lay
10 citizenry, one appointed member shall be a district attorney while
11 serving in that capacity, one appointed member shall be a sheriff
12 while serving in that capacity, and one appointed member shall be a
13 chief of police while serving in that capacity; provided, that the
14 sheriff and police chief members shall have successfully completed
15 an approved course of instruction for peace officers as required by
16 law.

17 C. Annually the Commission shall select one of the Commission
18 members to serve as chair and one member to serve as vice-chair.
19 The Commission shall meet at least quarterly. The chair shall
20 preside at all meetings of the Commission and shall have the power
21 to call meetings of the Commission. In addition, meetings of the
22 Commission may be called by a majority of the members. The vice-
23 chair shall perform these functions in the absence or incapacity of
24 the chair. A quorum of four members of the Commission shall be

1 necessary to conduct any official business. All actions taken by
2 the Commission shall be by a simple majority vote of a quorum. In
3 the event of a tie vote, the measure being voted upon shall be
4 deemed to have failed.

5 The Commission shall adopt rules of procedure for the orderly
6 performance of its functions.

7 D. Members of the Commission shall serve without salary but may
8 be reimbursed for travel and other expenses in attending meetings
9 and performing their duties in the manner provided for other state
10 officers and employees under the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
11 The lay-citizen members shall be paid Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per
12 diem for attendance at meetings of the Commission. No other
13 provisions of law shall be construed as prohibiting public officers
14 from also serving as members of the Commission, nor shall any other
15 provisions of law be construed as prohibiting public officers or
16 public employees from performing services for the Commission without
17 compensation. It is further provided that no town, city, county or
18 other subdivision or other agency of state government shall be
19 prohibited from receiving a grant or from benefiting from grants or
20 expenditures of the Commission for the reason that an officer or
21 employee of such town, city, county or other subdivision or agency
22 of state government is a Commission member or employee."
