16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified		
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6m of Title 70, unless		
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:		
19	A. As used in this section:		
20	1. "HIV" or "Human Immunodeficiency Virus," means a human		
21	retrovirus known to cause AIDS; and		
22	2. "AIDS" or "Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome," means the		
23	final and most serious stage of HIV, causing damage to the immune

- 1 system and includes a number of opportunistic infections which can 2 result in death.
- B. Each school district in the state shall provide age-4 appropriate instruction about HIV, AIDS and related issues:
 - 1. At the option of the local school district, a minimum of once during the period from grade five through six;
- 7 2. A minimum of once during the period from grade seven through 8 nine; and
 - 3. A minimum of once during the period from grade ten through grade twelve, with heightened emphasis on modes of transmission, prevention methods, virology and relevant statistics.
 - C. The instruction shall include:

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- 1. The definition of HIV and AIDS;
- 2. How the virus is transmitted;
- 3. How the virus is not transmitted;
- 4. An analysis of the transmission and methods of prevention for sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) and HIV, with an emphasis on abstinence from sex and intravenous drug use;
- 5. Identification of risk behaviors and situations involving possible exposure to HIV; and
- 21 6. A demonstration of refusal skills, negotiating skills and 22 peer resistance skills related to sexual health.
- D. The State Department of Education shall create or implement a medically accurate curriculum for HIV education. A school

    curriculum; provided, any curriculum must be approved by the State
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    Department of Health for medical accuracy.
