Supp. 2017, Section 1353), which relates to apportionment of certain sales tax 14 revenue; providing for deposit of certain amount into certain fund; creating the Teacher Compensation Fund; 15 providing for allocation to fund; providing purpose of fund; providing for codification; providing 16 contingent effective date; providing effective date; and declaring an emergency. 17 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 20 SECTION 1. A new section of law to be codified 21 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.15 of Title 70, unless 22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23

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A. Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:

B. 1. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section 26-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes from the flexible benefit allowance funds disbursed by the State Board of Education and the State Board of Career and

Technology Education pursuant to Section 26-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

- 2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the amounts set forth in the minimum salary schedule specified in subsection A of this section, the district shall be required to provide written notification to the teacher prior to his or her employment, or if already employed by the district, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the date the district elects to provide retirement benefits such that the teacher's salary would be less than the minimum salary schedule.
- C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from a college recognized by the State Board of Education. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts that are accredited by the State Board of Education or appropriate state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by an educational credential evaluation service in accordance with industry standards and guidelines and approved by the State

 Department of Education. The person seeking to have credit granted for out-of-country teaching experience shall be responsible for all

costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation service. The Board shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are affiliated with the United States Department of State.

- D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-of-country teaching experience as a certified teacher or its equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of education from crediting more years of experience on district salary schedules than those allowed for state purposes.
- E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience of a:
- 1. Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;
- 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;
- 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor, which were completed while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor

was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a teacher in Oklahoma;

- 4. Certified teacher, which were completed while employed by the Department of Human Services Child Study Center at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, if the teacher was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and
- 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist, which were completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school psychologist or psychometrist.
- F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.
- G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, by a school district during the 2017-2018 school year was receiving a salary above the amounts provided in Section 18-114.14 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the person shall receive a salary increase of twelve and seven-tenths percent (12.7%) above the salary they received during the 2017-2018 school year, provided they remain employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the

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certified personnel are reduced proportionately. The salary
increase provided for in subsection A of this section shall be in
addition to, and not as a replacement for, the step increase
indicated for the certified personnel pursuant to the State Minimum
Salary Schedule, as provided for in this act.
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SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 1353, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 349, O.S.L. 2015 (68 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 1353), is amended to read as follows:

- Section 1353. A. It is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code to provide funds for the financing of the program provided for by the Oklahoma Social Security Act and to provide revenues for the support of the functions of the state government of Oklahoma, and for this purpose it is hereby expressly provided that, revenues derived pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code, subject to the apportionment requirements for the Oklahoma Tax Commission and Office of Management and Enterprise Services Joint Computer Enhancement Fund provided by Section 265 of this title, shall be apportioned as follows:
- 1. The first Three Hundred Million Dollars (\$300,000,000.00) of such revenues shall be deposited to the Teacher Compensation Fund created in Section 3 of this act;

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b. in the event that additional monies are necessary pursuant to paragraph 6 of this subsection, such additional monies shall be deducted in the proportion determined by the State Board of Equalization pursuant to paragraph 3 of Section 2355.1B of this title from the monies apportioned to the General Revenue Fund;

2. 3. For FY 2003, FY 2004 and FY 2005, ten and forty-two onehundredths percent (10.42%), shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be placed to the credit of the Education Reform Revolving Fund of the State Department of Education and for FY 2006 and each fiscal year thereafter, ten and forty-six one-hundredths percent (10.46%) shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be placed to the credit of the Education Reform Revolving Fund of the State Department of Education;

- 4. 5.

 a. except as otherwise provided in subparagraph b of this paragraph, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and for each fiscal year thereafter, eighty-seven one-hundredths percent (0.87%) shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be further apportioned as follows:
 - (1) thirty-six percent (36%) shall be placed to the credit of the Oklahoma Tourism Promotion Revolving Fund, but in no event shall such apportionment exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) in any fiscal year, and
 - (2) sixty-four percent (64%) shall be placed to the credit of the Oklahoma Tourism Capital Improvement Revolving Fund, but in no event shall

such apportionment exceed Nine Million Dollars

(\$9,000,000.00) in any fiscal year, and

- b. any amounts which exceed the limitations of subparagraph a of this paragraph shall be placed to the credit of the General Revenue Fund;
- 5. 6. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and for each fiscal year thereafter, six one-hundredths percent (0.06%) shall be placed to the credit of the Oklahoma Historical Society Capital Improvement and Operations Revolving Fund, but in no event shall such apportionment exceed the total amount apportioned pursuant to this paragraph for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts which exceed the limitations of this paragraph shall be placed to the credit of the General Revenue Fund; and
- $\frac{6\cdot}{7\cdot}$ During the first fiscal year after the State Board of Equalization has made a determination as provided in Section 2355.1B of this title, regarding a baseline amount of revenue apportioned pursuant to paragraph $\frac{3}{4}$ of this subsection, and for each fiscal year thereafter, in no event shall monies apportioned pursuant to paragraph $\frac{3}{4}$ of this subsection, paragraph 3 of Section 1403 of this title and subparagraph c of paragraph 1 of Section 2352 of this title be less than such baseline amount.
- B. Provided, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and every fiscal year thereafter, an amount of revenue shall be apportioned to each municipality or county which levies a sales tax

subject to the provisions of Section 1357.10 of this title and
subsection F of Section 2701 of this title equal to the amount of
sales tax revenue of such municipality or county exempted by the
provisions of Section 1357.10 of this title and subsection F of
Section 2701 of this title. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall
promulgate and adopt rules necessary to implement the provisions of
this subsection.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.97 of Title 62, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to be designated the "Teacher Compensation Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of monies received pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 1353 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes and any monies designated to the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be used for the purpose of increasing the compensation of teachers employed by public school districts and agencies of this state, as authorized by the Legislature.

SECTION 4. The provisions of Section 2 of this act shall become effective on the same date that the provisions of Enrolled House

Bill No. 1033 of the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the 56th

Legislature become effective.

1	SECTION 5. The provisions of Sections 1 and 3 of this act shall
2	become effective July 1, 2018.
3	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
5	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
7	SECTION 7. The provisions of this act shall be contingent upon
8	the enactment of the provisions of Enrolled House Bill No. 1033 of
9	the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature and
10	shall not become operative as law otherwise.
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
