19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.192, is		
21	amended to read as follows:		
22	Section 1210.192. Any minor child, through the parent,		
23	guardian, or legal custodian of the child, may submit to the health

- 1. A certificate of a licensed allopathic or osteopathic physician as defined in Section 725.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, stating that the physical condition of the child is such that immunization would endanger the life or health of the child; or
- 2. A written statement by the parent, quardian or legal 7 custodian of the child attesting that they have viewed the information required by subsection B of this section and objecting to immunization of the child; whereupon the child shall be exempt from the immunization laws of this state.
 - B. A nonmedical exemption granted pursuant to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section shall only be valid for two (2) school years and only after the parent or guardian:
- 16 1. Views multimedia information regarding the risks of not vaccinating their child and the possible medical complications 17 resulting from vaccinations on a website maintained by the State 18 Department of Health that provides a link to the Centers for Disease 19 Control and Prevention's "Vaccine Excipient and Media Summary"; 20 provided, a parent or quardian with more than one child shall only 21 be required to view the information once to satisfy the provisions 22 of this subsection. The viewing of multimedia information required 23 24 by this paragraph shall not exceed ten (10) minutes; and

- C. The Department shall develop and maintain a stable Internet website to provide the information described in subsection B of this section. No information regarding who uses the website shall be collected or maintained by the Department. The website created pursuant to this section shall:
- 1. Ensure that the materials and form described in subsection B

 of this section are printable only after viewing information about

 the risks of not vaccinating a child and the possible medical

 complications resulting from vaccinations;
 - 2. Provide clear and prominent instructions on how to receive the information in printed form;
 - 3. Be accessible to the public without requiring registration or use of a user name, a password, other user identification or the payment of a fee; and
- 4. Only contain information that conforms to the highest standards of academic research, including but not limited to peer review.
- SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.193, is amended to read as follows:
