1 hundred fifty registered voters for candidates for United States Congress and five hundred registered voters for candidates for 3 Lieutenant Governor, Corporation Commission, Attorney General, State 4 Auditor and Inspector, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, 5 State Treasurer, Commissioner of Insurance and Commissioner of Labor; or by a cashier's check or certified check in the amount of 6 7 Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for candidates filing with the Secretary of the State Election Board or the secretary of a county 8 9 election board; provided, however, such cashier's check or certified 10 check shall be in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 11 (\$1,500.00) for candidates for Governor, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for candidates for United States Senator and Seven 12 13 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for candidates for the United States 14 Congress, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for candidates for 15 Lieutenant Governor, Corporation Commission, Attorney General, State 16 Auditor and Inspector, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, 17 State Treasurer, Commissioner of Insurance and Commissioner of 18 Labor.

B. A filing fee received by the Secretary of the State Election Board shall be deposited in the State Election Board Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 3-107 of this title. A filing fee received by a secretary of a county election board shall be deposited in the County Election Board Special Depository Account authorized by Section 3-108 of this title.
