Supp. 2017, Section 6-190), 14 which relates to teacher certification; modifying types of certificates issued by the State Board of Education; establishing initial, career, mentor and 15 lead teaching certificates; listing criteria for each 16 certificate; requiring criminal background check for all teaching certificates; specifying certain 17 contract requirements for mentor and lead teachers; mandating additional contract days and annual salary 18 supplements; and providing an effective date. 19 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 21 22 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-190, as 23 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 24 2017, Section 6-190), is amended to read as follows:

1	Section 6-190. A. The board of education of each school
2	district shall employ and contract in writing, as required in
3	Section 6-101 of this title, only with persons certified to teach by
4	the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher
5	Preparation Act, except as otherwise provided for by Section 6-101
6	of this title and by other law.
7	B. $\underline{1.}$ The Board shall issue $\frac{1.}{2}$ an initial teaching certificate
8	to teach to any person who:
9	1. Has
10	<u>a.</u> <u>has</u> successfully completed the teacher education
11	program required by the Oklahoma Commission for
12	Teacher Preparation; Educational Quality and
13	Accountability,

15	<u>b.</u> <u>has</u> graduated from an accredited institution of higher

- <u>f.</u> <u>beginning</u> November 1, 2001, has on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history records.
- 2. The Board shall issue a career teaching certificate to any person who:
 - a. has successfully completed the program as provided in Section 6-195 of this title,
 - b. has been awarded career teacher status as defined in Section 6-101.3 of this title,
 - <u>has demonstrated the competencies of a career teacher</u>
 <u>as determined under the comprehensive evaluation of</u>

1		the initial teacher pursuant to Section 6-101.16 of

A lead teacher may have a teaching load of not more than fifty

percent (50%) student instruction to allow the lead teacher to spend

time on co-teaching, co-planning, peer reviews, observing career

teachers, model teachers and mentor teachers and other duties

mutually agreed upon by the superintendent and the lead teacher.

The duties of a lead teacher may satisfy the qualitative evaluation

component for teachers as required by Section 6-101.16 of this title

by performing the duties listed in this paragraph.

- C. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate to teach to any person who:
- 1. Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements set forth in subsection F of this section;
- 2. Holds certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards;
- 3. Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or
- 4. Has successfully completed a competency examination used in the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets the requirements set forth in subsection G of this section.
- D. Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial any Oklahoma teaching certification shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State

- Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history
 record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the
 Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective
 until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history
 record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible
 for the cost of the criminal history records.
 - E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.
 - F. 1. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate to teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-state certificate or to a person who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state or out-of-country certificate.
 - 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state or out-of-country certificate.

- 3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history record checks.
- 4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this subsection.
- G. 1. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate to teach to a person who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority of the other states. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a certification area used in Oklahoma.
- 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon

1	receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may
2	issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt
3	of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check.
4	The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the
5	cost of the criminal history record checks.
6	H. The terms of the contracts issued to mentor and lead
7	teaching certificate candidates shall include the following:
8	1. Mentor - an additional ten (10) days to be used to
9	strengthen instructional leadership. A mentor teacher may receive
10	an annual salary supplement of at least Three Thousand Dollars
11	(\$3,000.00) in addition to the minimum salary schedule listed in
12	Section 18-114.14 of this title; and
13	2. Lead - an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to
14	strengthen instructional leadership. A lead teacher may receive an
15	annual salary supplement of at least Five Thousand Dollars
16	(\$5,000.00) in addition to the minimum salary schedule listed in
17	Section 18-114.14 of this title.
18	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
