NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4003 of Title 59, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 A. Every administrative body, state agency director or official 20 with authority over any occupational or professional license or 21 certification, and each of the respective examining and licensing 22 boards, shall, upon presentation of satisfactory evidence that an 23 applicant for licensure or certification is a low-income individual, 24 shall grant a one-year waiver of any fees associated with such

1	licensure or certification. For purposes of the section, "low-
2	income individual" means an individual who is enrolled in a state or
3	federal public assistance program, including, but not limited to,
4	the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Medicaid or the
5	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or whose household
6	adjusted gross income is below one hundred forty percent (140%) of
7	the federal poverty line or a higher threshold to be set by the
8	executive branch department that oversees business regulation.
9	B. Each administrative body, state agency director or official
10	with authority over any occupational or professional license or
11	certification, and each of the respective examining and licensing
12	boards, shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this
13	section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
