9 An Act relating to public health; providing
10 definitions; requiring certain residents in long-term
11 care facilities to have a pharmacogenomics profile
12 conducted; specifying content of profile; requiring
13 behavioral health services to be provided in
14 accordance with assessment and pharmacogenomics
15 profile; authorizing the State Board of Health to
16 promulgate rules; providing for codification; and
17 providing an effective date.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1992 of Title 63, unless there
21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. As used in this section:

23 1. "Pharmacogenomics" means the study of how genetic factors
24 will affect a person's response to certain medications, particularly
adverse side effects; and

1 2. "Behavioral medication" means a medication capable of
2 affecting the mind, emotions, behavior, activities and drugs used in
3 the treatment of mental illness or brain activity.

4 B. Every person who requires a prescription for a behavioral
5 medication such as antidepressants, bipolar and antipsychotics or is
6 taking four or more drugs may have a pharmacogenomics profile
7 conducted and recorded in the person's medical record.

8 C. A pharmacogenomics profile shall include the results of at
9 least eighteen genes tested and be accompanied by treatment guidance
10 for each disease state-tested. Each person having such a test shall
11 be entitled to receive a copy of the results or to view them in the
12 medical record.

13 D. Any behavioral health services provided shall be in
14 accordance with a comprehensive assessment and the person's
15 pharmacogenomics profile.

16 E. The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules as
17 necessary to implement the requirements of this section.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
