NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 23 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 24

- A. There is hereby created to continue until December 31, 2019, the "Commission on the Prevention of Abuse of Elderly and Vulnerable
- 3 Adults".

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- B. The Commission shall consist of thirteen (13) members as follows:
- 1. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Human Services or designee;
 - 2. The Administrative Director of the Courts or designee;
- 9 3. The Executive Coordinator of the District Attorneys Council or designee;
- 4. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and
 Substance Abuse Services or designee;
 - 5. An attorney in private practice with experience in quardianship casework, appointed by the Governor;
 - 6. A guardian of a family member with diminished capacity, appointed by the Governor;
- 7. A health care provider or employee of a health care provider, appointed by the Governor;
 - 8. A member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 9. A member of a statewide organization that advocates on behalf of the elderly and family caregivers, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

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- 1 10. A member of a local or statewide organization that
 2 advocates on behalf of adults with intellectual and physical
 3 disabilities, appointed by the Speaker of the House of
 4 Representatives;
- 5 11. A member of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro 6 Tempore of the Senate;
 - 12. A member of the Oklahoma Bar Association, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and
 - 13. A member of a local area agency on aging, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
 - C. Appointments to the Commission shall be made by October 1, 2018. Members of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. A vacancy on the Commission shall be filled by the appointing authority.
 - D. The Commission shall convene no later than December 1, 2018, to conduct an organizational meeting. The Commission shall elect a chair and vice-chair at the organizational meeting. A majority of the members present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. The Commission shall be authorized to meet at such times as may be required in order to fulfill the duties imposed upon the Commission in subsection E of this section.
- E. The Commission shall study, evaluate and make
 recommendations for any changes to state policy, rules or statutes
 to better provide adequate protections and services for individuals

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- who may be at risk for abuse, neglect or exploitation under existing adult guardianship laws by reviewing the following:
 - 1. Existing guardianship statutes to determine if changes could improve protections for elderly and disabled adults;
 - 2. The guardianship services available to individuals through the Oklahoma Department of Human Services;
 - 3. Efforts at the local level to provide guardianship services; and
 - 4. Funding needs and availability for guardianship services, including an examination of existing and potential funding sources.
 - F. The Commission shall prepare a report of its findings and recommendations for the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 1, 2019.
 - G. Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for serving on the Commission, but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:
 - 1. State employees who are members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act in Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
 - 2. Legislative members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their

1	duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74
2	of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
3	3. All other members of the Commission shall be reimbursed by
4	the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for travel expenses
5	incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the
6	State Travel Reimbursement Act.
7	H. The Commission shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting
8	Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.
9	I. Staff assistance for the Commission shall be provided by the
L 0	Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives.
