21	have sacrificed their lives while serving in the line of duty and
22	they continue to remain an inspiration to all who work in public
23	safety across the state; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Department of Corrections plays an
important role in the safety and security of the citizens of the
State of Oklahoma; and
WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Department of Corrections is equally
dedicated to serving victims of crime as well as applying the
sentence given by the courts to ensure justice is being served; and
WHEREAS, the staff, volunteers and members of the Oklahoma Board
of Corrections work to ensure offender well-being by taking a
steadfast approach to promoting positive changes in behavior and
reintegration back into society.
