13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-124 of Title 47, unless there
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	Any person driving under a commercial class A license shall not
18	be required to obtain a hazardous material endorsement pursuant to
19	49 C.F.R. Section 383 if the person is:
20	1. Acting within the scope of the license holder's employment
21	as an employee of a custom harvester operation; and
22	2. Operating a service vehicle that is:
