18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21	Section 1435. A. Every person who breaks and enters <u>the</u>
22	dwelling house of another, in which there is at the time no human
23	being present, any commercial building or any part of any building,
24	room, booth, tent, railroad car, automobile, truck, trailer, vessel

- 1 or other structure or erection <u>including an outbuilding</u>, as defined
- 2 | in subsection B of this section, in which any property is kept, or
- 3 breaks into or forcibly opens, any coin operated or vending machine
- 4 or device with intent to steal any property therein or to commit any
- 5 | felony, is guilty of burglary in the second degree.
- B. As used in this section, "outbuilding" includes a shed,
- 7 | garage, cabana, cottage or pool house or any structure subordinate
- 8 to, but not connected with, the primary residence or building on a
- 9 parcel of property.
- 10 | SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1436, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Section 1436. Burglary is a felony punishable by imprisonment
- 13 | in the State Penitentiary custody of the Department of Corrections
- 14 as follows:
- 1. Burglary in the first degree for any term not less than
- 16 | seven (7) years nor more than twenty (20) years; and
- 2. Burglary in the second degree not exceeding seven (7) years
- 18 and not less than two (2) years.
- 19 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 20 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1443 of Title 21, unless there
- 21 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 22 A. Every person who breaks into or forcibly opens any coin-
- 23 operated or vending machine or device with intent to steal any
- 24 property therein is punishable as follows:

- 1. If the value of the property is less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), the defendant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed one (1) year, or by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine;
- 2. If the value of the property is One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or more but less than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00), the defendant shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not to exceed two (2) years, or in the county jail not to exceed one (1) year, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine;
- 3. If the value of the property is Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) or more but less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), the defendant shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not to exceed five (5) years, or in the county jail not to exceed one (1) year, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine; or
- 4. If the value of the property is Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) or more, the defendant shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not to exceed eight (8) years, or by a fine not to

1	exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such
2	imprisonment and fine.
3	B. In addition to any penalty imposed, the court may order a
4	person convicted under this section to pay restitution to the
5	victim, including restitution for any property damage, as provided
6	in Section 991a of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
7	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
