12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
14	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
15	A. There is hereby created until December 31, 2018, a task
16	force to research the consideration of creating a partnership
17	between the Department of Corrections, the Oklahoma prison system
18	and the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education in
19	order to provide education opportunities for incarcerated offenders
20	once they are released from prison.
21	B. The task force shall be comprised of nine (9) members to be
22	appointed as follows:
23	1. Two members appointed by the Governor;
24	

- 1 2. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the 2 Senate:
 - 3. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
 - 4. A member representing the Department of Corrections;
- 5. A member representing the faith based community of this state; and
 - 6. A member representing the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education.

The chair of the task force shall be selected by the Governor.

- C. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any final action of the task force. For purposes of this section, five (5) members shall constitute a quorum.
- D. The task force may meet as often as may be required in order to perform the duties imposed upon it. The chair shall call the first meeting and all subsequent meetings shall be made at the call of the chair.
- E. The meetings of the task force shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
- F. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation or travel reimbursement.
 - G. Staff support shall be provided by the Senate.
- 23 H. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and
 24 recommendations by December 15, 2018, to the Governor, the President
